
SALLA SIMUKKA



MARESI

(Schildts&Söderströms 2014, ca. 180 pp.)

THE THIRD BOOK set in Turtschaninoff's mythical world takes place generations after Arra and Anaché. The Red Monastery, located on a small, southern island, is a refuge and a haven for girls. One of them is Maresi, a 13-year-old with an appetite for learning and books, who fled here from famine and poverty four years ago. She is thoughtful and empathetic, caring for the smallest novices of the monastery and spending her time in the vast library in the House of Knowledge.

THE DANGERS of the outside world enter the island in the form of Jai, a girl with a dark past. She has fled her home after seeing her father and uncle bury her sister alive for speaking to a young man. Soon her father and a crew of hired thugs arrive on the island in an attempt to bring Jai home, and Maresi is confronted with her worst fears: she can no longer hide in books and words but must be the one who acts

Turtschaninoff extracts new worth and potential from the fantasy genre. Elements of fantasy are toned down to make way for a realistic depiction a nomadic people's struggle for their existence. The book is also a 'bildungsroman' of sorts, using the central character of Anaché to explore issues of feminism and gender. The characters' contact with the spiritual world is seamlessly incorporated into this beautifully woven narrative.

Turtschaninoff has created a saga of three stand-alone books all set in a Nordic fantasy world with a magical nature, intricate laws and young women defiantly pursuing their destinies. Lyrical and inspired by history, it's like Tolkien from a female perspective.

ANACHÉ

(Schildts & Söderströms 2012, 389bb.)

Can love and grief turn you into someone else?

IN THE SECOND BOOK set in Turtschaninoff's fantasy universe, Anaché grows up in a nomadic tribe with a rigid hierarchical structure. She has trouble conforming to the strict rules of male and female conduct, and

is secretly acquiring forbidden knowledge from her brother. After her brother and mother die in a snowstorm brought on by a shaman, Anaché assumes the identity of her brother in order to keep her loved ones with her. When the shaman upsets the balance of the world, Anaché has to find her way back to who she truly is in order to save her people.



ARRA

(Söderströms 2009, 251 bb.)

IN THE FIRST NOVEL set in Turtschaninoff's unique fantasy world, Arra is a girl so unwanted and unseen by her family that she has turned mute. Instead she becomes skilled at listening to the music of the world and learns to gently collaborate with its magic. As Arra struggles to find her own voice, her destiny becomes entwined with that of her country. When war strikes, only Arra

can save the man she loves, the Prince of Lavora.



ANNUKKA SALAMA

Annukka Salama has studied costume design and architecture and has a degree in film and TV production. She has worked, for example, on the production of children's programmes at the Finnish Broadcasting Company YLE. She says she has never stopped fancying rock stars, air-drumming when nobody is watching or looking for four-leaved clovers. The idea of squirrellike faunoid girl Unna first came to her while spending a summer day scooting and climbing trees with her two daughters. The Faunoids Trilogy has developed an enthusiastic fan base, and Salama is currently working on a screenplay based on the series.

SIXTEEN-YEAR-OLD UNNA is always landing on her feet, climbing trees backwards and performing breakneck somersaults on the skateboard. When she meets a group of guys led by the brooding, handsome and snakelike Rufus, she finds out that there are others like her. They give her a sense of community - but also introduce new dangers into her life. Some of them are as sweet as a kiss, others as deadly as a hunter's bullet.

THE GROUP IS made up of four unusual guys. Joone is a punk rocker who pursues anything that glitters, Vikke is a ladies' man with equine powers, and Ronni is a human bat who drinks store-bought blood and conceals his fangs with black tooth lacquer. Unna begins to lead a double life, and the love between the world's only faunoid girl and the last dragon boy is put to the test by friends, parents, and the hunters who pursue her.

WAVE TAMER

Fire Charmer balances fantasy and authenticity in an amusing way. The setting is, by the most part, realistic: a nameless small town in Finland. Scenes of skating and drinking beer in city parks and causing disturbance at a festival have familiar echoes

of teenage summers, and Salama doesn't slip into unnecessary moralizing.

UNNA IS DELIRIOUSLY in love with Rufus, but weighed down by the mystery surrounding her adop-

tion. When the faunoid group travels to California to let loose, she becomes aware of some astonishing facts regarding her own past and Rufus's aristocratic ancestry. IN CALIFORNIA the group meets a pair of faunoids: siblings Nemo and Eden. The trip escalates into a rescue mission when a group of hunters capture Unna. During the chase, Rufus discovers that Unna has, in fact, been created specifically for him via genetic manipulation and in vitro fertilization: the hunters have bred a mate for him in order to increase the planet's wild dragon population. Unna is forced to re-evaluate her feelings for Rufus.



BIRD WHISPERER

(Harakanloukku, WSOY 2014)

THE FINAL PART of the trilogy begins in a state of chaos: Rufus is distracted by heartbreak, and Unna is trying to fight her instincts by spending time with Nemo, a chameleon boy she met in California. When Vikke disappears, the group comes together and enters Venori, the realm of the hunters.

RUFUS IS HARDLY able to tolerate the cold as a dragon, and the rescue mission is a race against the clock. Rocker Joone falls in love with Ivar, a hunter,

which results in more tension. Vikke is found in an underground cell, scheduled to perform in a gladiator-like fight to the death.

THE GROUP DISCOVERS an ancient faunoid prophecy and the crown jewels of the dragon family inside the city hall. A standoff results in Unna nearly dying and Rufus burning down the city. Realizing his responsibility, Rufus steps to the throne with Unna by his side and vows to continue his mission of hunting hunters, as the faunoid prophecy stated.



ENDANGERED

(Uhanalainen, Tammi 2013, 444 bb.)

HAVING RETURNED to Helsinki, Raisa is trying her best to let go of what happened to her in Wolf Creek. But her great love, Mikael, is not easy to forget, the wolves are calling her, and Wolf Creek has not yet revealed all of its secrets. If you can't trust own feelings - whom can you trust?



HUNTED

(Jäljitetty, Tammi 2014)

MIKAEL, THE NEW LEADER of the pack at Wolf Creek and the love of Raisa's life, has left, and Raisa gets off to a disastrous start at the Academy of Fine Arts. But when she has to track down her brother Mitja, she is thrown into an adventure on a mystical Greek island involving Daemons, creatures who have the ability to interact with Plato's "world of ideas." When Raisa escapes the island with Mitja, she encounters the wolves, and Mikael, once more.





TRACED

(Vainuttu, Tammi 2015)

RAISA AND MIKAEL ARE spending their first summer together in Helsinki. Everything feels perfect until Raisa starts to realize what everybody means when they talk about a werewolf needing another werewolf as a partner. Determined not to give up, she joins Mikael and her brother on their mission to help the pack in Wolf Creek where people scared of wolves are stirring trouble. Then Mikael is captured, kicking off a series of events that cause Raisa to discover something shocking about her own identity.
